

EXPEDITED LICENSING PATHWAYS AVAILABLE FOR HEALTH CARE WORKERS IN RESPONSE TO COVID-19

The Missouri Hospital Association advocated with various state agencies and elected officials for expedited pathways to allow health care workers to provide services to patients in Missouri. The governor invoked the provisions of Sections 44.100 and 44.110, RSMo, declaring a state of emergency related to the spread of COVID-19. [Executive Order 20-04](#) was subsequently issued where the governor granted departments, including the Department of Commerce and Insurance, and the Division of Professional Registration and its boards the authority to temporarily waive or suspend any statutory requirement or administrative rule or regulation under the director’s purview, upon approval of the Governor’s Office. Please consult the relevant state agency with questions about processes and specific applications. Executive Order 21-07 has extended the below waivers. Individual boards have the ability to suspend waivers as deemed appropriate.

Temporary license	A temporary license may be issued for no more than a twelve-month period by the appropriate licensing board to any otherwise qualified health care professional licensed and in good standing in another state and who meets such other requirements as the licensing board may prescribe by rule and regulation, if the health care professional: (1) Is acting pursuant to federal military orders under Title X for active duty personnel or Title XXXII for National Guard members; and (2) Is enrolled in an accredited training program for trauma treatment and disaster response in a hospital in this state; or by any available means, including electronic mail.

(3) If the health care professional is acting pursuant to the governor’s declaration of an emergency as defined in section 44.010 , such temporary licensure shall be issued pursuant to this subdivision for a two-week period and, upon license verification, may be reissued every two weeks thereafter. 2. For purposes of this section, the term “health care professional” shall have the same meaning as such term is defined in section 383.130

Licensure reciprocity	Any resident of Missouri who holds a valid current license issued by another state, territory of the United States, or the District of Columbia may submit an application for a license in Missouri in the same occupation or profession for which he or she holds the current license, along with proof of current licensure in the other jurisdiction, to the relevant oversight body in this state.

The NCLEX® is administered in Pearson Vue test centers. All Pearson Vue test centers closed March 17, 2020, and are expected to be closed through at least April 16, 2020. State Statute 335.081 (6)(b), RSMo allows a graduate nurse to practice after graduation pending the results of their first licensing exam or 90 days after graduation, whichever first occurs. The Board of Nursing has extended the graduate exempted practice period an additional 90 days for each nurse that will be taking the exam for the first-time and whose graduate exempted practice period expired or will expire during the period of time that Pearson Vue is not administering the NCLEX® exam. Anyone who graduated on or after December 16, 2019, has not previously taken the NCLEX® and has not been denied a license is now authorized to practice as a graduate nurse pending the results of their first licensing exam or 180 days after graduation, whichever first occurs. Fingerprint sites, nursing programs and many boards of nursing are closed or operating on limited hours. The board recognizes this impedes the ability to request background checks, transcripts and license verifications. In order to allow for continued employment, the board will automatically extend any unexpired temporary permit an additional six (6) months. This does not require any action by the nurse. To check the license expiration date of a temporary permit at www.nursys.com using QuickConfirm License Verification . A nurse who holds a temporary permit should enroll As a Nurse in Nursys e-Notify at www.nursys.com/enotify in order to receive permit expiration date reminders. The Board amended internal procedures for processing applications to include utilization of online verifications in lieu of waiting for printed verifications to come directly from other state boards; pulling the NPDB reports for applicants if none are on file at the time of application processing; and not holding up licensing if they do not have a proposed business address or a small lapse in time in the activities statement. Applicants should write COVID across the top of their application to ensure PRIORITY process and approval. The waiver eliminates the application and office procedure for accepting licensed AAs who possess an active license without discipline in any state or territory of the United States or the District of Columbia to practice in the same manner and to the same extent as AAs are authorized to practice in Missouri without having to file an application. This waiver is limited to AAs who are licensed in another jurisdiction without discipline on their license who wish to practice in Missouri during the State of Emergency.
