Questions	Solutions
In what forms can Telehealth be provided?	Telehealth can be provided through audio, text messaging, video conferencing, and more.
What equipment is required to deliver Telehealth?	Broadband internet connection, video platform, and technology support. Learn more here .
What types of services can be delivered via Telehealth?	Taking vitals, diagnosis, physical therapy, mental health, and more <u>here</u> .
What are the current state reimbursement policies?	Missouri Medicaid will reimburse for services delivered via live video.

Can new patients be established with Telehealth?	Yes, a physician-relationship can be established without having direct or indirect contact with the patient.
Do I need new or different credentials to practice through Telehealth?	No, although there are state by state variations. See here for more.
Where can providers conduct Telehealth?	Providers should always use private locations when treating patients.
How do you provide patients with documents through Telehealth?	Paper documentation can be moved to online resources.
