COVID-19 & DELAYED CARE

CANCER

New research finds that more than 90,000 Missourians missed essential cancer-related health screenings as hospitals and health care providers reduced these services to prepare for COVID-19. The long-term consequences of missed screenings for cancer detection and treatment are clear.


Cancer Screening Visits by Week: Missouri Residents, Federal Fiscal Year 2019 vs. 2020
