Rural hospitals played a critical role throughout the COVID-19 pandemic and remain essential to Missouris ongoing recovery.

Rural areas have a higher percentage of children and elderly living in poverty, with a 29% lower per capita income than wrong.

Fewer rural Missourians have health insurance. Voter-approved Medicaid expansion could improve health access.
