## Dear Governor Parson:

Thank you again for the thorough update you provided on yesterday's biweekly hospital call on the status of the COVID-19 response in the state. Your update about the continuing response and improvement to the COVID-19 pandemic — as evidenced through ongoing declines in case counts and increasing supply of vaccine — is great news. We appreciate your ongoing leadership and focus on the many issues we have faced over the past 12 months.

We also appreciate your comments that now is not the time to reverse course and we must stay vigilant and deploy all critical mitigation efforts. The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention also is urging caution as we return to normalcy through continued use of face masks, social distancing and other mitigation activities that have served us to date.

This is sound advice and strong leadership, particularly as we collectively watch three ongoing or upcoming events over the next several weeks — spring break season, Easter and the U.K. variant.

Your initial emergency declaration and subsequent extensions paved the way for hospitals and health care providers to effectively combat the pandemic so we could arrive at this juncture. As you shared on yesterday's call, your administration is reviewing the current emergency declaration. With that declaration set to expire on March 31, MHA, on behalf of its member hospitals, requests an extension of the emergency declaration and attendant waivers.

I am attaching a spreadsheet of currently effective waivers, which have been critical for the health care industry to adjust as necessary to address supply chain and other operational delays, increased use of telemedicine, patient surge and the fallout from delayed care. These waivers are set to expire along with the emergency declaration. We believe these waivers should be extended concurrent with any extension of the emergency declaration so that hospitals can continue to adapt to the changing circumstances of the pandemic. Should an increase in gatherings or a variant cause a surge in the short term, these waivers will allow the affected hospitals to quickly and adequately respond.

Many of these waivers are necessary to effectuate those granted by the Department of Health and Human Services and the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services. HHS has indicated it likely will extend its public health emergency declaration through the end of 2021 and give health care providers a 60-day wind down period before terminating any waivers. We propose a similar process in Missouri — preserve the status quo in the short term, while allowing us to work with state officials to identify waivers we can begin to wind down and those needed to continue to ensure harmony between federal and state law.

MHA's members appreciate your leadership in ensuring health care providers have the tools necessary to continue the fight against COVID-19 and thank you for your consideration of this request.
