

RhoGAM Pharmaceutical Supply Chain Shortage Technical Assistance

OVERVIEW OF CURRENT SITUATION

The FDA, ASHP and the Association for the Advancement of Blood and Biotherapies are reporting Rho(D) immune globulin (Rhlg) shortages. MHA has also become aware of the impact of this shortage, especially among Critical Access Hospitals and clinics, including Federally Qualified Health Centers.

According to ASHP, the RhoGAM, manufactured by KAMADA, is the primary manufacturer with shortage, however, alternative manufacturers have supply available. The KAMADA shortage is ongoing and anticipated to last throughout 2024, with no specific release or anticipated resolution date at this time.
